

Regulation of Duplicate and Prior Publication

Although, as a general rule, authors may not submit for publication a paper that has already been published elsewhere, the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) does permit such publication, subject to a number of factors. These include, *inter alia*, the approval of both editors, the fact that the journals are intended for different audiences, the fact that the secondary version informs readers that the paper has been printed elsewhere, etc.

The Journal of Israeli Medical Students (JIMS) was established in March 2021, with the intent of helping Israeli medical students gain experience in scientific writing and encouraging them to engage in research at an early stage of their professional and academic lives. JIMS is a pre-print platform, one which is neither peer-reviewed nor indexed.

The International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) states that pre-prints that are not peer-reviewed do not block future publication in a peer-reviewed journal if the author discloses the previous posting.

As a pre-print platform, we are obligated to direct readers to the final article once published, but it is the author's responsibility to inform us about the final publication, and to provide the proper link, DOI and PMID when indexed.
